

FUNDRAISING

Our two events, Territory Days Booth and the Greek Festival, were very successful in 2013 raising over \$34,000. With each year, we continue to upgrade our equipment to improve our operation. This year we received a donation to purchase a new upright five-shelf freezer and we bought two new fryers to be used at the Dessert Booth. These fryers will improve our serving time and certainly decrease the wait time of our customers for the Loukamathes. Our biggest improvement will be in the preparation of our food with the purchase of a five-shelf commercial convection oven. We are now able to prepare everything we serve in-house and also prepare roasted legs of lamb and chicken souvlaki daily during the festival. This purchase has eliminated preparation elsewhere and the logistical moving of our products which took lots of time and effort. One last note - Volunteerism! Did you know that 33% of our volunteers at the festival are friends and neighbors from outside the church? As for our in-house volunteers, great thanks to you for making our events successful - without your participation we could not have events. Festival dates in 2014 - August 22, 23 and 24.

TREASURER

Over the past 10 months, the collections totaled \$109,262. During that same period, our expenses were \$142,211. We were able to pay down the mortgage principle by \$10,800, which makes the balance of our building less than \$90,000. We hope to pay it off soon.

We started a Building Fund Account towards a future new location for our community. To date, we have raised \$6,285.

Other accounts of interest include the Youth Account, which stands at \$641, and the Bookstore currently at \$386.
